INTRODUCTION

Founded in 1991, Bronte College of Canada is a private, co-educational day and boarding school committed to providing a learning environment that emphasizes academic excellence and individual growth. Bronte College offers courses specially formulated to meet the needs of Canadian and International students and to satisfy the requirements of the Ontario Ministry of Education Curriculum guidelines.

MISSION

Bronte College of Canada emphasizes the development of students to their full potential in terms of intellectual, ethical, physical, and cultural qualities. Students who graduate from Bronte College of Canada will succeed in multicultural, multidimensional competition at universities and colleges around the world. Bronte College has a team of caring, highly trained, and experienced staff members who are available to assist students in their academic and personal needs.

LOCATION

The campus is centrally located in Mississauga in the Greater Toronto Area. It is situated in a quiet parkland that is conducive to learning. The College is only a 20-minute drive to downtown Toronto, the financial capital of Canada, and just minutes away from all major highways and centres of business. Shopping centres and medical facilities are nearby and can be accessed by walking or public transportation. Of particular interest is the easy 60-minute drive to Niagara Falls, at the United States border.

PEDAGOGY

To support our fundamental learning principles, class sizes are maintained with an average of 16 students per teacher. Students are engaged in class by dedicated and highly qualified teaching staff. Many of our teachers have Masters and Doctorate degrees, as well as teacher's certification. The Advanced Placement (AP) Program is combined with the regular high school curriculum to motivate students and challenge their minds. Guidance for the students' chosen path of study is given by knowledgeable counsellors.

DRESS CODE

Every Bronte College student wears a uniform. This identifies them with the school and enhances their sense of belonging. The uniform consists of grey-coloured dress pants, a plain white-collared shirt, a tie, a Bronte College blazer, sweater or vest and black dress shoes. Full dress uniform is mandatory for every student on each school day, all occasions and on all field trips.

STUDENT SUCCESS

Since the inception of Bronte College a large majority of our graduates have gained admissions to top universities in Canada and around the world including direct entry to medical and law schools in the U.K. This is significantly higher than the average public high school in Ontario, where only 33% of graduates go to university.

CAMPUS

Bronte College's campus is composed of a single building on 4.5 acres of land, which hosts its academic facilities and the student residence. The building has restricted access to authorized staff, students and visitors and is monitored 24 hours a day. The residence and cafeteria are open to our students all year round. There is also a state-of-the-art fitness facility; a gymnasium; a study hall as well as fully equipped computer, science, art labs; and a music room. The entire building has both wired and wireless internet connection.

STUDY HALL AND COMPUTER LAB

The study hall is quiet and spacious with floor to ceiling windows overlooking forested conservation land. Computers are available in the study hall for student research as well as in the modern computer lab. The computer lab is supervised and is important for the development of technological acumen.

CAFETERIA

The full food service cafeteria provides nutritious meals catered by an international team. The full meal plan is offered seven days per week, and includes breakfast, lunch and dinner from Monday to Friday, brunch and dinner on weekends (Saturday and Sunday), and weekday evening snacks. The cafeteria is open 365 days a year. Special meals are prepared to accommodate students with dietary restrictions.

RESIDENCE

Bronte College of Canada is a boarding school; we own and operate our student residence. International students are required to stay in residence until graduation. The campus residence offers safe and comfortable rooms to over 300 students. The majority of the rooms are for single occupancy: only a limited number of shared rooms are available. Living in the residence is ideal and convenient, especially during the winter months when students do not have to brave the cold temperatures to attend classes. Furthermore, the residence is open to our students during the holidays and school breaks. Smoking and alcohol are strictly prohibited in the school, in the residence, and on the school grounds.

The residence rooms have a traditional layout. A single room consists of a bed with bedding, closet, study desk, and a sink. Each room has a telephone and access to the internet.

The residence is not co-educational. Male and female students are restricted to different levels of the residence building and are closely monitored 24 hours per day, 7 days a week.

The bathroom facilities are shared by five or six rooms. Students are able to use the cash card laundry facilities (washers and dryers) in the residence building.

RESIDENCE LIFE

Outside the school, the residence department organizes visits to the city's main library, movie theatres, swimming pool, bowling alley, and popular shopping centres. On weekends, there are organized day or overnight trips to exciting places of interests, for example Niagara Falls, Canada's Wonderland, Montreal, New York, and Blue Mountain Ski Resort. Typically, there is one trip every second weekend.

The Residence Life Program is mandatory for students who are under the age of 17 years, and includes most of the weekend day trips described above. Supervised evening study sessions are mandatory for students who are younger than 17 years of age.





OVERVIEW OF HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS OFFERED

Bronte College is internationally recognized for providing quality, holistic education to young minds in a highly stimulating learning environment. This reputation is aided by Bronte College's strong support system with small class sizes, a tutorial centre and highly qualified staff. Our main objective is to build a solid foundation and prepare students for post-secondary education not only by learning, but by learning to understand and applying that understanding for a deeper knowledge. Bronte has been proud to consistently produce well-qualified graduates who are highly sought after by the most popular universities in Canada and around the world. Bronte College offers the Ontario High School Curriculum from grades 9 through 12, the Advanced Placement (AP) program, as well as an English as a Second Language (ESL) program.

The academic scheme is based on a credit system where one credit is gained for every 110-hour course successfully completed. A student may earn as many as 4 credits in a single semester.

Semesters start in September, February and the summer semester in July. Students may join Bronte College during any one of these convenient intakes. In addition, we offer a unique specialized grade 12 (Pre-University) Express program in January to highly motivated students with a strong academic background. Students can complete the Express Program either in June or August.

If a student fails a course, they only need to retake the failed course and does not need to repeat an entire academic year.

ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL DIPLOMA (OSSD)

Students who successfully complete high school will be awarded the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) from the Ontario Ministry of Education. Students need to achieve at least 30 credits over grades 9-12, 18 of which are compulsory courses and the remaining 12 are electives allowing students to choose courses from other areas of interest. Furthermore, students must also complete 40 hours of community service and pass the Ontario Literacy Test in order to fulfill all OSSD requirements.

GRADES 9 & 10

Grades 9 and 10 are comprised mainly of courses aimed to provide the skill and content base for the specialization years in grades 11 and 12. At Bronte College, we believe that these courses are not just academic foundations, but are also important for life experience and the personal development of our students. Therefore, along with meeting the requirements of the OSSD, we also teach skills to foster social, cultural, recreational, emotional and intellectual growth.

Bronte College is organized around a semestered system. A student can accumulate up to 8 complete high school credits from the beginning of September to the end of June without going to summer school. Hence, a student who has successfully completed grades 9 and 10 will have achieved 16 credits.

GRADES 11 & 12

Bronte College offers university and college preparation courses for grades 11 and 12 designed to equip students with the knowledge and skills they need to meet the entrance requirements for university and college programs. Students need to successfully complete 14 credits in grades 11 and 12 in order to obtain an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

Students aiming to qualify for university admission must complete at least 6 grade 12 credits at the pre-university level. The teaching and learning emphasizes theoretical aspects of the course content as well as concrete applications. All university or college preparation courses are based on rigorous provincial curriculum expectations with emphasis on the development of both independent research and learning skills. Students need to demonstrate that they have developed such required skills when they complete the senior courses.

EXPRESS PROGRAM

The Express Program is a grade 12, pre-university program which starts in January and has been specially designed for qualified students who plan to complete their 6 Pre-University courses and enter university in September of the same year.

COURSE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR UNIVERSITY PROGRAMS

The following course selections are recommended for students who are aiming to be accepted into a specific faculty in university. University acceptance is based on the average of the best 6 grade 12 courses, including the prerequisite courses. Proof of English proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS and MELAB etc.) is also required for students from non-English speaking countries.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) PROGRAM UNIVERSITY CREDIT TRANSFER

The Advanced Placement (AP) program, established over fifty years ago, is recognized for its excellence by over 90% of the universities in Canada, the United States, and more than 55 countries. All students enrolled in AP courses can choose to write the AP exams in May. On request, results are forwarded by the AP College Board directly to universities of their choice. Successful results of AP exams provide students with possible first-year university transfer credits, advanced placement or both. By earning university transfer credits or advanced placement, students can save both time and university tuition fees.

BRONTE UNIVERSITY EXPERIENCE PROGRAM

Bronte College is privileged to offer university level courses to academically motivated students while they are still completing their high school program. These students may enroll in up to two University of Guelph first year courses (taught at Bronte College, Mississauga campus) while studying for their last semester of the grade 12 university preparatory program. Students benefit by broadening their intellectual horizons, developing study habits for rigorous course work and sharpening cognitive and problem solving skills.

This further preparation gives our graduates an unparalleled edge in university preparation as well as unique standing in the university admission process.

COOPERATIVE (CO-OP) EDUCATION

Co-op is a planned learning experience for grades 11 and 12 students that integrates classroom theory with learning experiences in a workplace setting. Students are assessed by multiple performance evaluations conducted by the employer, teacher and student. Placements are arranged with approved employers for approximately 3-4 hours each day (either a.m. or p.m.) and are located within a close distance from Bronte College, with easy access to local transportation. Students are still able to take up to 2 other courses at Bronte College while taking advantage of the Co-op program. Students may use Co-op as one of the 18 compulsory credits they require to graduate with their OSSD.

THE "ARTS"

Bronte College recognizes the value of offering our students an expanded arts program to balance our challenging and rigorous academic program. Our extensive course selection offers students interactive and dynamic education in the areas of Visual Arts, Media Arts, Drama, Physical Education, Fashion Design, Hospitality and Music. Throughout the year, students from these programs demonstrate their acquired talents with exhibitions, competitions and performances. Our school band has received much public attention and has been invited to perform at local schools.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAM

The Language Centre and English as a Second Language (ESL) Program at Bronte College allows students the opportunity to experience both a structured program, that helps to build the skills necessary for their success, and a more flexible independent study option to continue their language development.

The structured ESL Program helps our students excel both in and out of an academic environment. The program gives the students the opportunity to progress through the courses at their own pace, as they fulfill the language requirements set out in the program. The courses are designed to help the students' transition from an ESL environment to a full English academic program. The ESL classes have an average of 12 students per teacher which provides the support needed for these students to be successful in their development.

The Language Centre is based on a resource centre model which allows students to have an active part in their progression and offers a large amount of support to these ESL learners. The Language Centre houses a steadily growing amount of resource materials for students to work through as part of their customized program. Allowing the students to have access to the ESL resources, reading room, computer lab, and ongoing teacher support is the key to their success. The Language Centre's after school programs provide students with extra one-on-one help, peer tutoring and language based clubs and allows them to continue improving their language skills in a more informal setting.

The ESL department has an open door policy, so students can feel welcome to drop in at any time to get the extra support they require. Whether it is in relation to their language needs in academic classes, providing resources for proficiency test preparation, or general language concerns, the staff in the centre are always ready to help.

STUDENT SERVICES

The guidance and career services department assists students with their social and academic needs from discussing any issues the student is concerned with, to planning the student's future, including selecting the appropriate courses and applying for university. We speak with students and their parents to determine the student's goals and future plans and guide students in the right direction to be successful in their studies and in life. Students will always have the academic support they need as we monitor students' progress and make recommendations to utilize the academic support offered by Bronte College. Ensuring students are informed of the requirements to graduate and arranging university visits gives students the information needed to make the right decisions in selecting a university. Our guidance counsellors welcome students who may need someone to talk through their problems with, and at the same time informing students about extra-curricular activities and any events in the school helps them become more prepared and well-rounded for university. Our guidance counsellors provide parents with an avenue to contact teachers and to discuss their child's progress and any concerns that can help their child be more successful at Bronte College.





INDEPENDENT LEARNING CENTRE

The Independent Learning Centre (ILC) is designed to provide students with individual support to improve understanding and enhance academic success. The ILC is staffed by teachers and tutors. This team provides the expertise to deliver one on one, group and student led tutoring sessions. Tutoring can be arranged for students at lunch, after school and into the evening in most subject areas.

The guidance department supervises the ILC and monitors the academic progress of all students. Recommendations will be made to students performing below standard to seek assistance in the ILC. As well, courses required by students that are not offered in our regular academic schedule, may be arranged on an individualized basis.

The ILC offers a quiet and welcoming environment for students to seek help, to ask questions, or to study.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY

Bronte College recognizes the immeasurable value of education beyond the classroom. As such, a surfeit of extracurricular activities are offered. We offer organized and supervised athletic activities and student clubs every day after school. Athletic activities as well as intramural sports include but are not limited to soccer, basketball, floor hockey, badminton, volleyball, table tennis, cricket, yoga, and dance. Furthermore, we have a fitness room with supervised access seven days a week.

Various school clubs offered allow students to pursue personal values and interests such as the Environmental Club, International Students' Club, The Investment Club, Student Activity Council, and Residence Council. Our extended Arts program also includes after school band, jazz band, and choir.

PARENTAL COMMUNICATION

Research has shown that the more parents are informed and involved with their child's education, the more successful the students are in school. Bronte College understands the importance of this and has designed a web portal to facilitate communication between the parents and the staff as well as between parents and their child. The online portal includes information on attendance, student results, teachers' comments, daily homework, weekly projects and assignments.

UNIVERSITY OF GUELPH AT BRONTE COLLEGE, MISSISSAUGA

- FIRST YEAR UNIVERSITY COURSES

The University of Guelph, in cooperation with Bronte College of Canada, is now offering first year university degree equivalent courses at Bronte College in Mississauga. High school graduates (students who have completed high school and have graduated in their home country) who register with Bronte College and pass the Math and English Proficiency Tests are eligible to enroll in this program. Courses are taught by University of Guelph appointed instructors and commence in January, April and September of each year. Bronte College high school graduates can have the advantage of taking degree equivalent first year courses in this UGB Program while waiting to be considered for September university admission.

Students from countries where English is not their first language are required to submit a test score from one of the following tests: IELTS, TOEFL, MELAB. Applicants who do not meet the requirements are required to study pre-university English courses aimed at improving their level of English proficiency to a standard that meets the English Proficiency Requirements of universities. The pre-university English courses (UEP) will be in addition to this program.

After the first year UGB program at Bronte College Mississauga, students will be guaranteed admission to either the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Commerce program at the University of Guelph provided they have a minimum cumulative average of 70% in at least 4 relevant courses and proof of English Proficiency (www.bronte.uoguelph.ca). Students can also apply to be admitted into other degree programs at the University of Guelph and transfer their credits towards their degree. Students may also decide to apply to other universities within Canada and the United States and relevant credits obtained in this program can be considered for transfer.

STANDARD REQUIREMENTS BY CANADIAN UNIVERSITY

IELTS

Minimum overall score of 6.5, with no band lower than 6.

TOEFL

Internet based (iBT): a minimum total 89 with no individual scaled score less than 21.

Computer based (CBT): a minimum total 250, Test of Written English (TWE): score of 5 is required.

Paper based (PBT): minimum score of 600, TWE 5.0.

MELAB

Minimum overall score of 85 including composition score of 83 and oral score of 3.

SUMMER CAMP (AGES 10-17)

Bronte College first offered a Summer Camp (Language Study & Tour Program) in 1996. The success of the camp has grown with each year and has attracted young people from all over the world.

Bronte College offers 2 types of Summer Camps for students who would like to either improve their English through the Fun ESL Summer Camp or to those who would like academic enrichment with the Fun Math and Science Summer Camp.

The program is designed to provide constant supervision in a caring environment. Participants will experience Canadian culture through exciting trips and activities including major attractions and a wilderness experience. We are confident that children who attend our camps will return home with lasting memories and new friends from Canada and other countries.

All camps include classroom instruction, accommodation, nutritious meals, trips, health insurance, daily activities and weekend excursions.

FUN ESL SUMMER CAMP

The fun ESL Summer Camp focuses on communicative activities, learning to understand North American English through watching and discussing TV shows, the news and movies, reading and talking about current events, practicing different forms of writing and classroom debates. The program allows participants to learn English through formal in-class teaching, from applied science, arts, cultural activities, as well as from daily communication.

FUN MATH & SCIENCE CAMP

This camp caters to students who have an interest in Math and Science. The program is directed by our science faculty, who design activities that are both engaging and interesting piquing students' cravings for deeper knowledge. Participants will hone their skills in math and science through formal in-class teaching and experiments.

HOW TO APPLY

1. Submit a completed application form or apply online at www.brontecollege.ca. A photocopy of the passport, certified school reports or official transcripts for the past 3 years of education as well as the non-refundable application fee (CAD \$150.00, payable by bank draft to Bronte College of Canada) must accompany the application form.
2. Upon receipt of these documents the application will be reviewed. If the student is accepted, Bronte College will issue the student a Conditional Letter of Acceptance (CLOA). Fees payable will be stated on the CLOA.
3. Once payment is made to Bronte College, an official Letter of Acceptance and receipt of payment will be issued. International students can apply to the nearest Canadian Embassy or Consulate for a study permit.
4. For International students under 18 years of age, a signed Guardianship Request Form must be provided by the parents or legal guardian (together with the Service Fee for the preparation of a notarized Guardianship Letter).

School transcripts and the completed application form can be e-mailed to admissions@brontecollege.ca or faxed to 1-905-270-7828.

All new students are required to write the Bronte College Proficiency Tests in English and Mathematics, and Science if applicable.

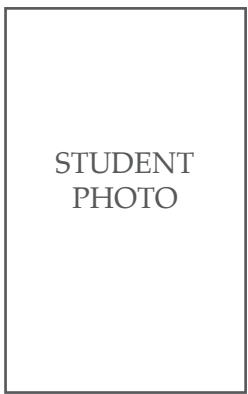
