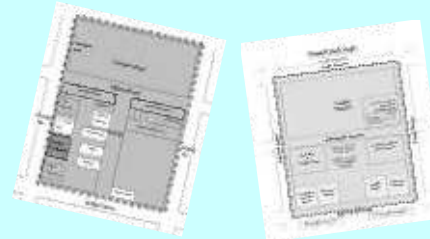

English Programs

ENGLISH COMMUNICATION PROGRAM

The English Communication Program will help you communicate effectively in English. You will learn how to use language structures and vocabulary in real-life situations.

If you are planning to enter a university or college, or just want to improve your IELTS® score, Pacific Gateway's IELTS® Program will help you acquire the skills you need to achieve your goals. You will have the opportunity to study authentic IELTS® questions from all sections of the test and receive error feedback and explanations. IELTS preparation is heavily integrated into this course, with a focus on the practical skills required to be successful in a university. Why the TOEIC® test?

The TOEIC test (TEST OF ENGLISH FOR INTERNATIONAL COMMUNICATION™) measures proficiency in international Business English, at intermediate and advanced levels. The TOEIC® Listening and Reading test is a paper-based one that provides an accurate measurement of the English capabilities of non-native speakers in listening, reading, and grammar. The TOEIC® Speaking and Writing tests are Internet-based tests that measure a person's ability to speak and write in English in the workplace, using key expressions and common, everyday vocabulary.

Certificate IV in TESOL (Sydney/Brisbane)

Designed as a TESOL Teacher Training Program, this course will prepare students to teach English in their home countries as well as overseas. Students who successfully complete the course will receive nationally accredited certificate which enables them to be able to teach English in Australia. 6 hours of individual teaching practice is required.

You can also gain an extra Certificate after completing this program.

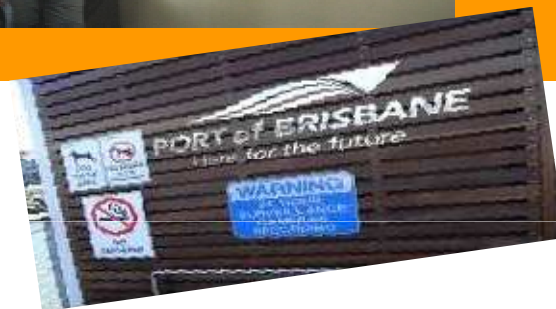
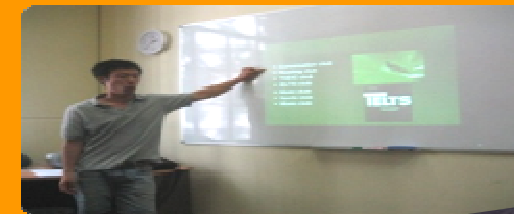
Certificate IV in International Trade

(Combination of fulltime study and remote learning packages available for Working Holiday Visa students.)

Research international markets / Analyse and present research information
Plan for international trade / Implement international client relationship strategies / Apply knowledge of import and export international conventions, laws and finance / Prepare business advice on export Free on Board Value / Prepare business documents for the international trade of goods / Undertake marketing activities / Promote products and services
Market goods and services internationally



Import project

In addition to the course work, Students will undertake a group project with an experienced exporter with an entrepreneurial focus. As a group, students will import a product into Australia. Students will purchase the product, export it from the country of origin, ship it to Australia, clear customs and then sell the product in Australia. The project aims to give you first-hand experience of the export / import process, to ensure that when students complete the course, students will have both an excellent academic understanding and direct experience of international trade.

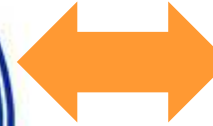
